On Wednesday 23rd October we will be holding our next 'Pulford School Book Swap' event! The event will take place after school from 3:30-4:15pm in the hall and is open to all pupils from Pre-school to year 4.

How does it work?

- 1. During the week commencing 14th October, Mrs Horsfield will be outside the main school gates before school, to collect any of your pre-loved books (fiction & non-fiction children's books) that you would like to swap. These books must be in good condition (Books with torn pages, scribbles, stains etc will not be accepted).
- 2. You will exchange your books (maximum of 5 books per person) for a **'Swap Token'** which will show the number of books you brought in to swap.
- 3. On Wednesday 23rd October, you will be able to browse and choose the books you want from the **Swap Hall**. You are allowed to take home the same number of books you brought in. Don't forget to bring your book swap token!
